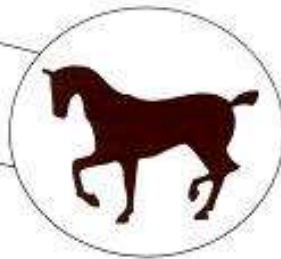

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Killarney is the Potato Capital!

Every day a truck load of potatoes leaves Killarney headed for the city and the coast. Depending on the season, at least 100 tonnes of potatoes are sent from Killarney to dinner tables across Queensland and New South Wales each week. That's over 500 potatoes for every man, woman and child living in our town.

The industry employs up to 60 people – you probably know someone who works producing Killarney potatoes or in associated businesses.

Why Killarney?

Killarney is renowned for its summer season potatoes. The Queensland Department of Primary Industries identifies Killarney as one of the “key areas for potato production” in Queensland.

The altitude and high rainfall of the plateau above Killarney, at The Falls and Acacia Plateau, are the secret to its success; allowing Killarney to produce potatoes when the rest of Queensland is too hot. These highland potatoes can be grown without irrigation.

The distinctive red soil in the mountains is highly prized by potato growers. A combination of nutrient content, altitude and rainfall helps red soil win out over black soil for potato production. Red soil potatoes are more visually appealing and look brighter in the supermarket. At the height of potato growing in Killarney the black soil plains were also planted with potatoes. But changing weather conditions and pricing - for a while a premium was paid for red soil over black soil potatoes – has significantly reduced the amount of acreage. (Those “in the know” still say the black soil potatoes taste best!)

What varieties of potatoes are grown?

Potatoes for purchasers! Killarney growers are sure to grow what people want to eat and cook with. Potato varieties are selected for their cooking quality, colour, disease resistance, and taste. Sebago are the multi-tasking variety grown by most of our local farmers - they grow well and taste good. Desiree and Crème Royale are also grown. Did you know potatoes have fashions and trends? Current “gourmet” varieties include Pink Eye, Dutch Cream, Pink Fur Apple, Kipfler, Maralyn, Nicola, & Nadine.

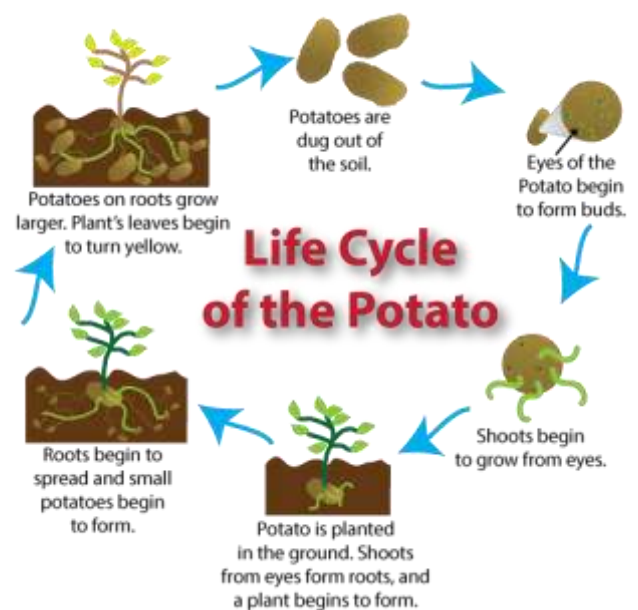
Who is growing Killarney potatoes in 2013?

Many farmers on the plains and in the mountains have grown potatoes since Killarney was first settled by Europeans, but in 2013 the following families are growing potatoes: Wickham Farms, the Watts Families - Daryl, Stewart and Jim - and Smith Families – Mal & Sam, John and Richard.

It's a potato's life....

Potatoes do have seeds but most potatoes are grown from tubers (mini potatoes). This means that potatoes are a clone of the original plant. Using good quality seed potatoes ensures a consistent crop and helps fight disease. Farmers might keep 2/3 seed potatoes from their own crop and buy 1/3 from propagators.

Planting: Driving through the highlands you begin to see the green cattle pastures turn red as the paddocks are prepared and planted from late August to December. The distinct green rows start to appear. Paddocks are planted and rested for up to five years to keep disease at bay. Our local growers combine their potato farming with beef cattle grazing to make the most of the off season for potato growing.



Flowering: White flowers begin to top the potato plants eight weeks after planting.

Harvest: Potatoes are harvested from New Year through to June. Planting is staggered and potatoes are harvested to meet different market requirements.

The majority of Killarney potatoes are now picked by machine. Some potatoes are still picked by hand when the potato type, terrain or weather are not conducive to machine picking. All potatoes were picked by hand in the 1980's until it became harder to get pickers, they became more expensive and picking technology improved. Wickham Farms created their own potato picker to suit the Killarney area. Potatoes are taken to the sheds to be graded by hand and eye. The Sebago variety of potatoes yields approximately 14-16 tonne per acre. (Though 25 tonne per acre was reached in the mid 90's due to favourable conditions.) They are prepared for sale and off they go...



Where are Killarney potatoes off to?

Our potatoes are very popular! Wickham Farms supplies fresh cut potato skins to Sizzler restaurants, and other cut styles to Lite n Easy, and clubs, pubs & restaurant catering on Brisbane and the Gold Coast. Their brushed potatoes go to Coles supermarkets in Qld and NSW. Mal & Helen Smith supply their biologically grown potatoes to online retailers Food Connect. The Brisbane markets are another destination for local potatoes.

More to it... In order to have enough potatoes to supply their markets all year round Wickham Farms grow potatoes in Killarney, Clintonvale, Atheron, Bundaberg, and Gatton. They plant 800 acres a year across all their farms. And all those potatoes come back to Killarney to be packed or fresh cut.

Local History As early as 1887 floods were documented to have destroyed potato crops at the head of the Condamine River, 20 tonnes of potatoes were washed away. The Warwick Argus of 13 November 1894 outlined the visit of a parliamentary party led by TJ Byrnes and their interest in the "succession of wheat, maize, and potato fields" between Emu Vale and Killarney. In 1919 the Brisbane Courier reported a record breaking sale at the Roma Street market "23 bags of potatoes from Killarney being purchased at the rate of £32 per ton". In the 1930's a report on Brisbane's Potato Supply noted that a farmer planting 10 acres of potatoes in Queensland would be considered a big grower.

When The Falls area was opened for selection, the potato was part of the armoury of the selectors as they set out to turn rainforest into farmland. Potatoes were planted into the rainforest soils to keep weeds at bay and used to feed the family and workers. Extras could be bartered for other supplies and services. Changing methods helped improve production and the 1950's saw local families such as Smiths and Wickhams growing potatoes for local supply and markets. The introduction of the Sebago potato in the 1960's was another leap forward for production. In the 1980's potatoes were grown throughout the black soil plains around Killarney as well as in the mountains. Itinerant pickers followed the seasonal work. In 2012, Wickham Farms employs people from all over the world to work in their processing sheds.

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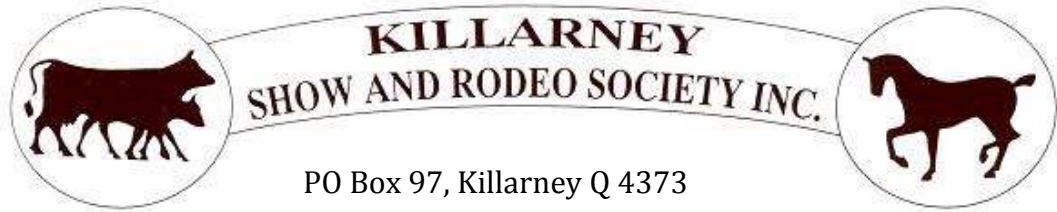

- To be eligible to compete and thus receive a prize, tickets and indemnity forms must be completed prior to entering the ring to compete. Failure to do so may result in prize forfeiture.
- The ring program will not be held up in the event of classes clashing. The competitor must decide which class they will compete in.
- Measuring - competitors will be responsible for ensuring that their horses are in the correct classes where height measurements are stipulated - in the case of a dispute, the onus will be on the exhibitor to provide proof of correct height.
- All led horses are to be registered and have current owner membership. Papers must be able to be produced on request.
- All first prize winners are eligible for championship without special entry.
- In all maiden competitions, horses must be maidens at the time of starting, not at the time of entering.
- All colts or stallions 2 years of age and over must be shown with a bit in their mouth, or with a stallion chain and safe headstall. All colts or stallions must be controlled by a person 17 years and over.
- Stallions may not compete in open hack classes. Only in classes provided for stallions.
- Approved safety helmets must be worn by competitors 17 years and under while competing in the ring.
- All competitors, if not members, will be required to pay admission to the Showgrounds.
- All protests must be in writing and lodged with the Show Secretary and accompanied by a deposit of \$50 within one hour of the notification of the judge's decision. If the protest is considered frivolous by the Committee, the deposit will be forfeited. In the hearing of all protests and disputes arising out of an award, the Committee shall abide by the judge's award unless it can be shown that the judge has been wilfully or accidentally misled.
- Any person, who, in the opinion of the Committee, behaves in an offensive manner, shall be removed forthwith from the Killarney Showgrounds.
- Ponies are to be ridden by a competitor under the age of 17 years.

- Where a new breed led section is requested the Committee asks that the submission be accompanied by a donation of \$50 to contribute to the cost of introducing the section.
- Local events – competitors may only compete at one show as a local. All horses, owners and riders are to have been stabled and resided in the district for three months prior to the Killarney Show.
- Show hunters
 - Ponies, galloways or horses must nominate in either hack or show hunter classes. Ponies or horses will not be permitted to nominate or compete in both classes. The exhibit is either a hunter or a hack. No refunds will be given
 - Stallions excluded in all classes

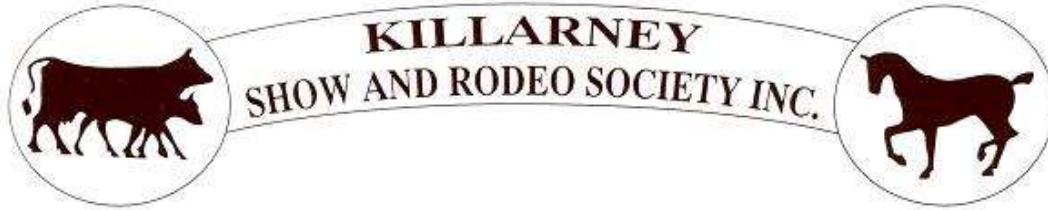

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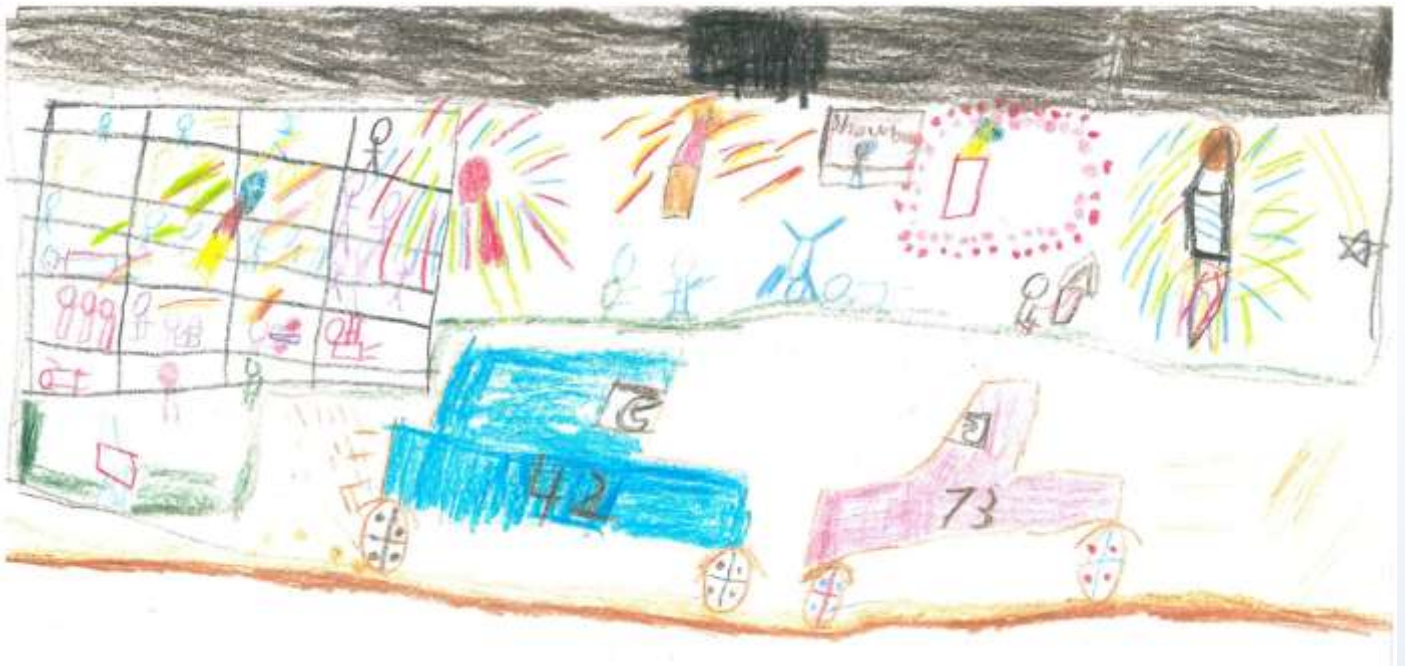
